- Abstract: We examine whether and how mandatory carbon disclosure affects the transmission of carbon emissions through a firm's global supply chain. Our analysis exploits the 2013 UK carbon disclosure mandate, which requires the reporting of Scopes 1 and 2 emissions (from firms' own activities and purchased energy) but not Scope 3 emissions (from firms' value chains). Using data from a major carbon data provider, we find that compared to benchmark samples, mandatory reporting firms show an increase in upstream Scope 3 emissions, while their foreign suppliers exhibit an increase in Scope 1 emissions, following the UK mandate. Consistent with supply chain relations influencing the extent of carbon outsourcing, the increase in upstream Scope 3 emissions is more pronounced among mandatory reporting firms with higher pressure to reduce emissions, greater power to influence suppliers' decisions, and fewer outsourcing constraints. Conversely, the increase in Scope 1 emissions is stronger among foreign suppliers with weaker bargaining power. Examinations of imports and production costs provide further support that the UK mandate leads to carbon outsourcing to suppliers. Our findings highlight the importance of considering corporate supply chains when implementing mandatory carbon disclosures.

ABSTRACTS

“Lender-borrower Interactions and Loan Contracting”

We examine the determinants and usefulness of lender-borrower interactions in commercial lending using proprietary data from a global bank. First, we show that loan officers’ interactions with borrowers are driven by borrowers’ business prospects, riskiness, and loan officers’ capacity. Next, we find that loan officers price loans more efficiently following interactions. We also find evidence that loan officers are more likely to use the information from interactions to grant loans than to reject loans, especially when they have more incentives to issue loans. We further document interactions to be more useful when loan officers cannot rely on alternative information sources. Finally, we find larger benefits for synchronous interactions and non-relationship-building interactions than other ones. Taken together, our study provides novel evidence on the drivers of loan officers’ interactions with borrowers and how loan officers use these interactions in their loan pricing and approval decisions.

“Re-doing the Audit”

When a company changes its audit firm, the incoming auditor will sometimes re-audit the previous year’s financial statements that were originally signed off by the company’s predecessor auditor. We examine the benefits of performing a re-audit. We find that an incoming auditor is more likely to re-audit when the risks of a misstatement are high and when the incoming auditor can expect to win more clients from the predecessor auditor by uncovering material misstatements that the predecessor missed. We find that the incoming auditor wins more clients from the predecessor auditor after the incoming auditor re-audits the predecessor’s work. Moreover, re-audits result in significantly more restatements. Consistent with re-audits being costly, we find that re-audits are associated with longer audit delays and higher audit fees. Overall, we conclude that re-audits have important consequences for financial statement users, incoming auditors, and predecessor auditors.

- We systematically delineate how stock market participants use Generative AI (GenAI) to aid their information search activities and trading. Drawing on a comprehensive dataset of user-platform interactions from one of China's largest GenAI service providers over the first half of 2024, we identify 1.8 million queries as stock-market-related, among which 81.4% focus on specific public firms, covering a wide range of topics, including business outlook, financial performance, and production and operations. Firm size, innovation investments, risk factors, and media coverage emerge as key determinants of these queries. Event-time analyses reveal that user activity reacts to information events such as earnings announcements and management forecasts, but these reactions largely parallel media coverage. We also find suggestive evidence of a direct substitutive relationship between informative management disclosures and GenAI platform activity. Furthermore, GenAI usage is linked to more informed trading, but lower liquidity, suggesting a widened information gap between traders that use and do not use GenAI. User fixed effects account for the largest share of variation in answer quality, with the accuracy of trading signals embedded in answers being associated with more positive user feedback and continued platform engagement. Overall, we provide comprehensive descriptive evidence on how users rely on GenAI to acquire information for stock trading, offering practical insights for GenAI providers, firms, and regulators into how to cater to the informational demands of (retail) investors.

 - Abstract: In 2016, the California Department of Insurance introduced a publicly accessible database aimed at promoting transparency about California-licensed insurers' investments in the carbon economy. This database significantly reduces the public's costs in assessing the size of individual insurers' carbon-intensive investments by eliminating the need to process complex investment data in insurers' publicly available statutory filings. Using a difference-in-differences design, I find that after the introduction of the database, affected insurers (i.e., those included in the database) reduce their holdings of carbon-intensive securities by approximately 15% relative to non-affected insurers. The reduction is more pronounced when insurers' portfolio data in statutory filings are harder to process, when insurers are under higher pressure from climate-minded external stakeholders, and when insurers are expected to suffer less loss from reducing their carbon-intensive investments. In terms of the economic consequences, I find that insurers' divestment from carbon-intensive securities lowers their investment returns and influences the financing decisions of their carbon-intensive investees. Overall, my findings suggest that enhancing transparency about institutions' carbon-intensive investments by reducing the public's information processing costs is an effective means of redirecting capital flows away from the carbon economy.

 - Abstract: In the U.S., insurers, the largest investors in the corporate bond market, can boost their earnings by accruing interest income from their corporate bond investments. Using detailed investment data from U.S. insurers, we document that insurers have higher corporate bond investments when their parents meet or just beat analysts' quarterly earnings forecasts, compared to when their parents miss or comfortably beat the forecasts. These higher corporate bond investments are accompanied by less equity and cash holdings. We also find that using corporate bond investment as an earning management strategy is more pronounced when bond offerings offer more opportunities for accruing interest income, when the parent's corporate governance is weaker, when the parent's managers have more compensation-related incentives to meet or beat earnings benchmarks, when insurers face more competition, when other earnings management techniques are used,

or when the insurance segment is more important to the parent. Finally, insurers suspected of helping their parents meet or beat earnings benchmarks experience a worse investment performance in subsequent years, presumably because by investing more in corporate bonds, the insurers forgo investment opportunities with higher longer term returns.
